

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT (OTA)

OTA 1000 Foundations of Occupational Therapy (3 Credits)

An overview of occupational therapy that describes the philosophy and theoretical foundation of the profession as well as the role of the occupational therapy assistant. Level I, observational experiences will be required.

OTA 1200 Neurologic Intervention in Occupational Therapy (4 Credits)

A study of the human nervous system with a focus on sensory and motor behavior. The lab is a focus on anatomy and physiology including assessment of function.

OTA 2008 Healthcare Management in Occupational Therapy (3 Credits)

Explores the roles of the OTA in healthcare delivery, with an emphasis on ethics, standards of practice, professional behavior, certification/licensure, emerging areas of practice, evidence-based practice and the healthcare team role delineation.

OTA 2010 Occupational Therapy Practice in Pediatrics (3 Credits)

An overview of disabilities and diseases that affect children, and the study of occupational therapy theory and practice as it pertains to the treatment of these disabilities.

Prerequisites: OTA 1200, and PSY 2001

OTA 2010L Occupational Therapy Practice in Pediatrics Lab (1 Credits)

A laboratory course in occupational therapy to complement OTA 2010.

OTA 2016 Occupational Therapy Practice in Physical Dysfunction (3 Credits)

The study of Occupational Therapy theory and practice as it pertains to the treatment of disabilities and diseases commonly treated by occupational therapy practitioners in the physical rehabilitation setting. The course emphasizes a holistic approach, focusing on both recovery and the enhancement of overall well-being in the adult population.

OTA 2016L Adult Rehabilitation in Occupational Therapy Lab (1 Credits)

Exploration of Occupational Therapy assessments, techniques, interventions and approaches utilized within the practice area of physical rehabilitation.

OTA 2018 Occupational Therapy Practice in Mental Health (3 Credits)

The study of Occupational Therapy theory and practice as it pertains to psychiatric diagnoses, and the impact of such upon one's occupational functioning.

OTA 2018L Occupational Therapy Practice in Mental Health Lab (1 Credits)

Exploration of Occupational Therapy assessments, techniques, interventions and approaches utilized within the practice area of mental health.

OTA 2034 Documentation in Occupational Therapy (3 Credits)

This course equips students with the skills needed for effective clinical documentation across diverse treatment settings and to demonstrate knowledge of various reimbursement systems and funding mechanisms. Students will develop skills to create and refine treatment goals, develop comprehensive treatment plans and become proficient in the various communication styles and formats commonly used by occupational therapy practitioners across the spectrum of clinical environments.

OTA 2090 Clinical Seminar in Occupational Therapy (1 Credits)

The study of occupational therapy treatment principles and applications as it pertains to clinical practice.

Prerequisites: Successful completion of all Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) and general education course work, and both OTA 2095.

OTA 2095 Level I Advanced Fieldwork (1 Credits)

A pass/fail course providing 20 hours of supervised fieldwork experience where the student applies treatment learned in Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) courses and learns about the roles of other professionals involved in patient treatment.

OTA 2195 Level II Fieldwork (11 Credits)

Sixteen weeks of clinical training under the direction of an occupational therapy practitioner in the practice areas of psychosocial dysfunction, physical dysfunction and/or pediatrics.

Prerequisites: Successful completion of all Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) and general education course work, and Level I and Level 1 Advanced Fieldwork.
